Dear Parents,

During the month of October, First Grade will learn about many different Saints. On November 1st, I would like all the students to dress up as their favorite Saint or Blessed. Students will need to wear their Saint/Blessed costume to school on November 1st (Thursday.) Kindergarten – Third Grade will be dressed as Saints, and we will “march” into Mass that morning to celebrate All Saints Day.

Each student will need to know their Saint's name, where they are from, and a few facts about their Saint's life that they can share with the class on November 1st. If possible, I would like to know who your child's Saint by October 22nd. They can either tell me or you may email me the name of the Saint or Blessed.

There are ideas for Saint's costumes on the bottom and the back of this note. The costume does not need to be store bought, but some thought needs to go into it. Please no weapons (such as swords for St. Michael or St. George) and no make-up or face paint. The costumes do need to be comfortable enough that the students can wear it all day.

Saint Nicholas: red robe, cardboard Bishop's miter covered with white or gold material, staff

St. Peter: robe, large cardboard keys wrapped with foil

An Apostle: Fisherman attire or robe, large nets, sandals, baskets
